

Bishop Speaks...

“The Jubilee of the Incarnation - Grace upon Grace” (Jn 1:16)

Dear Fathers, Brothers and Sisters,
Grace and peace of Christ be with you all!



As we come to the close of the Jubilee Year - a sacred time of renewal and grace that the Universal Church has journeyed through - our hearts are filled with deep gratitude to God who has blessed us abundantly throughout this year of spiritual rejuvenation. The Jubilee has been a time to rediscover the beauty of our faith, the depth of God's mercy, and the joy of belonging to His Church.

The Jubilee Year: A Global Celebration of Faith

The Jubilee Year, proclaimed by the Holy Father, has been a time of grace for the entire Church across the world. Throughout the year, dioceses, religious congregations, and communities have celebrated this extraordinary time through pilgrimages, reconciliation services, acts of charity, and renewed commitment to evangelization.

In Rome, the Holy Father Pope Francis presided over the solemn opening ceremonies on 24th December 2024 at the Vatican, inviting all Christians to open wide the “doors of faith” (Acts 14:27). With hearts uplifted, the faithful across the world began their journey as *Pilgrims of Hope*, walking together towards renewal and reconciliation. The Jubilee Cross - the symbol of redemption and new life - stood as a beacon uniting believers in prayer, faith, and solidarity.

Every celebration, every Eucharist, and every moment of grace reminded us that the Lord continues to dwell among His people - *Emmanuel, God with us*.

Strengthened by this living presence, we were filled with the hope that “does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us” (Rom 5:5). Thus, as *Pilgrims of Hope*, we journeyed forward, trusting that the grace of the Jubilee would renew the face of the Church and rekindle in every heart the fire of divine love.

The Jubilee in the Diocese of Sivagangai

In our own beloved Diocese of Sivagangai, the Jubilee Year began with great fervor and devotion. On the Opening Day, the faithful gathered in large numbers with priests and religious at our Cathedral Church, where the Jubilee Door was blessed and opened in a solemn liturgy. The Jubilee Cross, the visible sign of our redemption, was distributed to the Cathedral, vicariate centres, and diocesan shrines - reminding all that every corner of our diocese shares in the same saving grace of Christ.

Throughout the year, the parish feasts and village celebrations reflected the Jubilee theme, making every festal gathering a moment of renewal, forgiveness, and deeper communion with God. Our diocesan pilgrimage to St. John de Britto Minor Basilica, Oriyur, held on 5th October, was a profound spiritual event of the Jubilee Year. Organized on the theme of the Jubilee - “*Pilgrims of Faith and Witnesses of Hope*” - it brought together thousands of Faithful who journeyed in prayer, communion, and thanksgiving. The day was marked by deep devotion, inspiring liturgies, and a renewed commitment to live our faith with Gospel values. The Closing Celebration of the Jubilee Year will be held on 28 December 2025 in the Cathedral. This closing liturgy will not mark an end, but a new beginning - a renewed call to live our Christian vocation more joyfully and authentically in the days to come.

Though the ceremonial year comes to an end, the spirit of the Jubilee must continue in our diocesan and pastoral life. The following years must become a time of follow-up and fruit-bearing. Thus, the Jubilee's grace will not fade but will become a living flame that lights the future of our diocese.

The Jubilee - Mystery of the Incarnation

The Jubilee Year, in its deepest meaning, is the Jubilee of the Incarnation - the celebration of God's eternal love made flesh in Jesus Christ. When we celebrate Christmas, we remember the greatest act of divine mercy: "*The Word became flesh and dwelt among us*" (Jn 1:14).

In the Incarnation, God Himself entered into our history to redeem humanity and restore us to His friendship. The angel's message to Mary, "*Rejoice, full of grace, the Lord is with you*" (Lk 1:28), resounds as the announcement of the first Jubilee - a time when heaven and earth were reconciled in the womb of a humble maid. The Jubilee calls us to remember that Christ is our eternal Jubilee, for in Him every captivity ends (Lk 4: 18-19); the incarnation is the door of mercy opened once for all, through which all creation enters into grace; and every Christmas renews our Jubilee identity - sons and daughters set free by love. As St. Paul reminds us, "*When the fullness of time had come, God sent His Son, born of a woman, born under the law, to redeem those who were under the law, so that we might receive adoption as children*" (Gal 4:45). Therefore, every Christmas is a Jubilee - a celebration of divine mercy and freedom.

A Jubilee Christmas and New Year 2026

In this sacred season of the Jubilee Christmas, we are reminded that *we ourselves are the visible sign of God's living presence in the world*. The Lord invites us

to renew our consecration, rekindle our pastoral zeal, and radiate once more the joy of our vocation.

Let us be shepherds after the Heart of Christ - gentle and merciful, close to our people, and steadfast in love. The world today hungers for hope; our witness must be one of compassion, prayer, and holiness. The Word made Flesh calls us to be His living tabernacles - carrying His light into homes and hospitals, schools and streets, and most especially into wounded hearts. May our ministry shine with the tenderness of Bethlehem, the strength of Calvary, and the glory of the Resurrection!

As we celebrate the mystery of the Lord's Nativity, may the Child of Bethlehem fill our hearts with His peace and renew our faith. Let us step into the New Year with the firm assurance that "*He who calls you is faithful, and He will do it*" (1 Thess 5:24). May every home in our diocese become a cradle of faith, joy, and love. May the light of Christ dispel the darkness of indifference, heal divisions, and awaken hearts to God's mercy!

As we close this Jubilee Year and enter the Christmas season, let us echo the words of St. John: "*From His fullness we have all received, grace upon grace*" (Jn 1:16). With Mary, the mother of the Incarnate Word, let us lift our hearts in a Magnificat of gratitude for the wonders the Lord has done for us throughout this Jubilee Year.

I wish each of you all a Blessed Christmas and a Grace-filled New Year 2026!

A Diamond from the Red Sand

Msgr. Susai Jesu, OMI, Archbishop - Elect

Rev. Susai Jesu, OMI, a treasured son of the red-sand region of the Diocese of Sivagangai, was born on 17 May 1971 at Pushpavanam in Tamil Nadu. Drawn early to a life of faith and service, he joined the Missionary Oblates of Mary Immaculate and was ordained a priest on 27 July 2000 at the Church of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, Kanchipuram, by Most Rev. Lawrence Pius, Auxiliary bishop of Madras Mylapore.

A gifted linguist fluent in Tamil, English, and Cree, Msgr. Susai pairs his pastoral zeal with academic depth. He completed a Master's Degree in Psychology in India and later earned a Master's Degree in Counselling and Spirituality from St. Paul University, Ottawa. In 2007, he moved to Canada at the invitation of the Oblates (Lacombe Province), eventually becoming a Canadian citizen and dedicating his life to Indigenous and inner-city outreach.

His early Canadian ministry took him to the northern missions of Saskatchewan, serving as Pastor of St. Gertrude Parish, Pelican Narrows, and Our Lady of Seven Sorrows Parish, Sandy Bay in the Archdiocese of KeewatinLe Pas. These years shaped his deep commitment to Indigenous ministry, a hallmark of his priestly life.

On 2 July 2017, he was appointed Pastor of Sacred Heart Church of the First Peoples in Edmonton, a mission he shepherded until 15 July 2025. He also cared for the Ge'ez Rite (Eritrean) Catholic community from 2014 to 2023. At Sacred Heart, he became a pillar of healing, reconciliation, and compassion guiding food bank services, clothing drives, community meals, and inner-city outreach for the most vulnerable.

His leadership extended provincially and nationally. Msgr. Susai served on the Provincial Council of the Oblates (Lacombe Province) and advised Archbishop Richard Smith on Indigenous relations and inner-city concerns. He contributed to Canada's national journey of healing and reconciliation,

participating in the historic Papal Delegation to Rome and, in 2022, welcomed Pope Francis to Sacred Heart during the Holy Father's penitential visit.

Since 16 July 2025, Msgr. Susai has begun a new chapter in the Archdiocese of Edmonton. He now ministers as Pastor to several First Nations communities:

Across more than two decades of priestly ministry, Rev. Susai Jesu, OMI, has shone as a diamond from the red sand - a priest of compassion, cultural sensitivity, and unwavering dedication to reconciliation, community building, and the accompaniment of those most in need.

A Bird's View of the Jubilee Year 2025 A.D. (Holy Year)

Here I am trying to bring you all a bird's view of Jubilee Year 2025 A.D. (Holy Year), and it provides you all its brief overview. In fact, the Holy Year Jubilee 2025 A.D., is not an extraordinary Jubilee year, but the ordinary Holy Year.

Jubilee 2025 A.D. - Its Meaning and Preparation

The Jubilee 2025 A.D. is the ordinary Holy Year, running from 24 December 2024 A.D. (Christmas Eve) through 6 January 2026 A.D. (Epiphany) as it was planned early by the Pope Francis.

The Jubilee was formally proclaimed by Pope Francis, via the papal bull titled *Spes non confundit* ("Hope does not disappoint") which established the motto of the Jubilee: "Pilgrims of Hope."

In preparation for the Jubilee, the Vatican began planning through its relevant bodies. For instance, on 26 December 2021 A.D. the task to prepare the Jubilee was entrusted to the "Pontifical Council for the Promotion of the New Evangelization."

A design-competition was held for the official Jubilee logo in 2022 A.D. and the chosen logo (tied to the "Pilgrims of Hope" motto) was unveiled in mid-2022 A.D.

Other preparatory initiatives included cultural events, exhibitions and communication-efforts to reflect the Jubilee theme of hope for instance an exhibition of works by El Greco in the Vatican, presented as a "symbolic event" to anticipate the Jubilee, underlining "Hope in Christ."

In short: the 2025 A.D. Jubilee was carefully prepared over several years, conceptually built around hope, pilgrimage, renewal both spiritual and communal.

Jubilee 2025 A.D.: Year of Themes “Subsidiary Jubilee” Celebrations

Instead of having just one single celebration, the Jubilee Year 2025 A.D. is structured as a series of “jubilees within the Jubilee”, each focusing on a different group or aspect of Church life.

Some of the key themes / sub-jubilees by time/month:

Period / Month	Theme (Sub-Jubilee)
24 Dec 2024	Opening of the Holy Door at St. Peter’s Basilica official start of Jubilee
Jan 2025	Opening of the other “Holy Doors” in major basilicas: Saint John Lateran Basilica, Saint Mary Major Basilica, and Saint Paul Outside the Walls Basilica.
15-18 Feb 2025	Jubilee of Artists and the World of Culture involving cultural heritage, art, museums.
8-9 Feb 2025	Jubilee of Armed Forces, Police and Security Personnel
24-26 Jan 2025	Jubilee of the World of Communications
28-30 Mar 2025	Jubilee of the Missionaries of Mercy
30 May - 1 June 2025	Jubilee of Families, Children, Grandparents and the Elderly
7-8 June 2025	Jubilee of the Holy See
28 July - 3 August 2025	Jubilee of Youth (Young People) the biggest youth-focused Jubilee event.
Throughout 2025	Other jubilees included: of Workers; Entrepreneurs; Confraternities; Catechists; Seminarians; Priests; People with Disabilities; the Sick and Health-Care Workers; Choirs; Prisoners; etc.

Thus, the Jubilee 2025 A.D. becomes a broad, inclusive celebration reaching out to almost every group in the Church: youth, families, workers, educators, migrants, the sick, security forces, cultural workers, etc.

Key Vatican and Rome Events During Jubilee 2025 A.D.

Let us all recall some remarkable events at the Vatican/ in Rome during 2025 include:

Opening of Holy Doors: On 24 December 2024 A.D., Pope Francis opened the Holy Door at St. Peter’s Basilica the official start of the Jubilee.

For the first time in history, a “Holy Door” was also opened at a prison the door of the chapel at the prison in Rebibbia Prison in Rome (on 26 December 2024 A.D.) symbolizing hope, mercy, inclusion and welcoming for all, including prisoners.

A broad cultural-heritage component: for example, the previously mentioned exhibition of works by El Greco at the Vatican, timed as part of Jubilee-preparations.

Over the course of Jubilee year, the Vatican and the universal Church promoted pilgrimage through “Pilgrim’s Card”, itineraries in Rome, registration systems for pilgrim groups to visit the Holy Door etc.

A wide variety of “Jubilee” events keyed to different communities: artists, youth, workers, migrants, families, the sick, etc. This reflects a Church-wide effort to reconnect with all segments of society.

Concluding Celebration and Its Significance

It was announced that the Jubilee Year 2025 A.D. will officially conclude with the closing of the Holy Door of St. Peter’s Basilica on 6 January 2026 A.D. (Epiphany) marking the end of the Holy Year. However, Pope Leo XIV had asked the entire Catholic Church to have it on 28th December 2025 A.D. itself in order to make a meaningful conclusion. Pope Leo XIV has asked all the Cardinals, Archbishops and bishops to mark this concluding day with a diocesan celebration in their respective dioceses. Hearing the

invitation of Pope Leo XIV, the entire Catholic world is preparing itself for the Concluding Celebration on 28th December 2025 A.D.

The 2025 Jubilee is positioned not simply as a celebration, but as a year of hope, reconciliation, renewal and unity inviting Catholics worldwide to make pilgrimage, perform works of mercy, pray, and renew their faith commitment.

By dividing the Jubilee into many thematic sub-jubilees (youth, families, workers, the marginalized, the sick, cultural community...), the Vatican aims to highlight that every person and community has a place in this “Year of Hope.”

For many believers, the Jubilee will be remembered as a call to solidarity, compassion, spiritual refreshment, and a reminder that hope and mercy should guide Christian life.

The Meaning of Jubilee 2025 for All Catholics, including the Diocese of Sivagangai

The Jubilee 2025 A.D. offers opportunities for pilgrimage for those who can travel to Rome and visit the Holy Doors in major basilicas.

For those who cannot travel, local dioceses and parishes often organize Jubilee-celebrations modelled on the Vatican events: prayer, works of mercy, outreach enabling local faithful to share in the Jubilee spirit. In our diocese, Most Rev. Dr. Lourdu Anandam made know Oriyur Basilica and Idaikattur Sacred Heart Church as the pilgrims’ centres for the Jubilee Year.

The wide range of themes makes the Jubilee relevant to many different kinds of people: youth, workers, families, the elderly, the marginalized, the sick, cultural

professionals promoting a sense of universal belonging and community.

As a “Year of Hope,” it encourages renewal of faith, solidarity, compassion, and social engagement something particularly meaningful in a world facing conflicts, social challenges and crises.

Conclusion

Let us remember that the meaning and grace of the Holy Year Jubilee 2025 A.D. must continue to bear fruit in our personal, communal, and social lives. If the Jubilee leaves no lasting values within us, its celebrations and preparations would lose their true purpose.

As the Jubilee 2025 draws to a close, its grace continues to live on through the hearts and lives of the faithful. Personally, this Holy Year has invited each believer to rediscover hope, deepen their relationship with God, and renew their commitment to a life of prayer, mercy, and conversion.

Pastorally, it has strengthened the Church’s mission to accompany all people with compassion, to proclaim the Gospel with renewed fervour, and to build communities rooted in forgiveness, communion, and service.

Socially, the Jubilee has reminded the world that hope is a shared responsibility calling us to promote justice, care for the poor, uphold human dignity, and work together for peace and fraternity.

May the spirit of “Pilgrims of Hope” continue to guide us beyond this Jubilee Year, inspiring us to be bearers of God’s mercy, builders of unity, and witnesses of hope in our families, our Church, and our society. May this Jubilee 2025 A.D. leave within us a renewed strength to walk together as a people of hope, faith, and charity.


